

With their help, we have initiated the new Guardianship section and the GAAP program, which is designed to help segments of our community who have fallen between the legal cracks. Even the hope of the road is lost when one doesn't travel far enough. *A Meeting Across the River* portrays the subject young man's belief that this trip will see him buy into the American Promise, albeit illegally.

Hey eddie, can you catch us a ride?

Denied the road we are subject to failure. A tour of duty in family law is all it takes to understand the despair of *The River*, often beginning with a the shotgun marriage that followed the announcement of the pregnancy and the abrupt termination of what might have been in favor of what is.

Then i got Mary pregnant and man that was all  
she wrote  
And for my nineteen birthday i got a union card

We went down to the courthouse and the judge  
put it all to rest  
No wedding day smiles no walk down the aisle  
No flowers no wedding dress

The car took the couple away, but not far enough and they lost that chance to change venue and make the honest stand we all have come to believe in.

I got a job working construction for the

Tonight in jungleland

And yet there is some optimism left for Bruce even for those who decide not all the promise of the road they need is the street they grew up on. My roots lie in farming and mill work, and there is in my mind a whistle that blows at sundown even at the office. Rarely a week ends without me looking for the kind of reward Springsteen sings about in *Out in the Street*.

And darlin', fix your hair up right  
Cause there's a party, honey  
Way down beneath the neon lights  
All day you've been working that hard line  
Now tonight you're gonna have a good time

I work five days a week girl  
Loading crates down on the dock  
I take my hard earned money  
And meet my girl down on the block  
And monday when the foreman calls time  
I've already got friday on my mind

When that whistle blows  
Girl, i'm down the street  
I'm home, i'm out of my work clothes  
When i'm out in the street  
I walk the way i wanna walk  
When i'm out in the street  
I talk the way i wanna talk  
When i'm out in the street  
When i'm out in the street

When we are out on the street everything is right and life is not as hard as it is. We still have faith in the road, even if it is just the street. When I am out in the street, I walk the way I want to walk, I talk the way I want to talk. Out in the Street I am free. My slice of the American Promise is just beyond the door, right as I turn off Pacific and down Colby Avenue. Tonight, in Jungleland. ☺

The latest dispute concerned visitation. Under the Temporary Parenting Plan, Mr. “A” was entitled to drive his children to school every morning. He valued this daily contact, even though it was only for a few minutes. Ms. “A” thought it created daily problems. She moved for modification.

At the hearing, the judge decided to delete the morning visitation. Instead, he added evening visitation every other Tuesday and Thursday. At first, the judge said that this visitation would start at 5 p.m. Then he changed his mind and said that Thursday visitation would start after school. He didn’t specifically say when Tuesday visitation would start.

When the hearing finally ended, Ms. “X” was due in another department. She told Ms. “Y” that she could present the order ex parte, provided it reflected the court’s ruling. Ms. “Y” erroneously wrote an order that started evening visitation at 5 p.m. on both days. The judge signed this order.

Ms. “X” got the order later that morning. She immediately returned to the courtroom. The court was still in session, but Ms. “Y” was gone. Ms. “X” told the judge that he had said Mr. “A” could have the children after school. The judge changed the order to start visitation at 3 p.m. on both days.

When Ms. “Y” got the amended order, she was equally surprised. She filed motions for recusal and for a change in the parenting plan, which were denied. She also filed a bar complaint.

The Hearing Officer decided that Ms. “X” had engaged in improper ex parte contact. As a sanction, he recommended 6 months’ suspension.

By a vote of 10-2, the Disciplinary Board dismissed the charges. The Board decided that Ms. “X’s” ex parte contact was authorized by CR 60(a). That rule allows “clerical errors” to be corrected “after such notice, if any, as the court requires.” This has been interpreted as allowing correction of orders that fail to reflect the judge’s intention as shown by the record. Since the court did order any notice, Ms. “X” was not required to give any.

The Disciplinary Board’s decision is subject to discretionary review by the Supreme Court.

**MORAL:** The Rules of Professional Conduct set minimum standards. It’s often a good idea to go beyond the minimum. In this case, it was ethically permissible for Ms. “X” to act as she did – but think how much time, money, and anxiety she could have saved with a phone call to opposing counsel.
