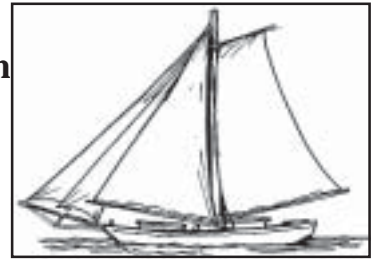

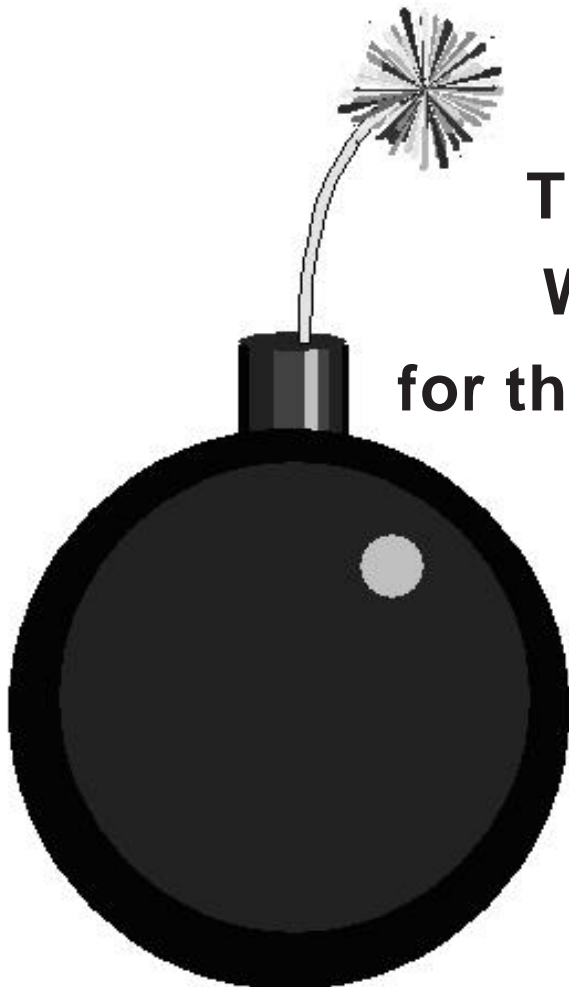

**FROM THE DESK OF
THE PRESIDENT,
RITA LOVE**

As the outgoing President of the Snohomish County Bar Association this will be my last President's Column. I will try to contribute articles in the future. The response to my column has been heartwarming. I am elated that so many folks have taken the time to contact me regarding the articles.

My musings have covered a lot of topics and this month I would like to give you some of my courthouse observations.

Starting with the backbone of the court system I first would like to tell you that the clerks of Snohomish County are the best! We have many dedicated people in the County Clerk's office that will assist you at the drop of a hat. As a Pro Tem I have been assisted by many that I was always glad to have on my team. They are knowledgeable, professional and dedicated to getting the calendars accomplished despite a heavy workload. The clerks in the main office are always pleasant, reliable and offer to help at a whim. I often cannot get the Microfilm machine to operate yet they never chide me on my shortcomings and come to my aid quickly. Unfortunately, I have also observed attorneys who are rude and condescending to many of the clerks.

The next group of folks I appreciate greatly is the team in the Court Administration. Dick Carlson has always been prompt in answering my questions and is ready to sit down with me to discuss issues when needed. The whole team is always courteous to all. Even when a difficult Pro Se is asking questions. I have witnessed the kindness and dignity that the presiding people show to all. However, again I have witnessed attorneys giving the administration folks a difficult time.

I would be remiss not to mention the Bar Association office. I am grateful for the help of Joyce and Melinda on a daily basis. They are there to assist bar members, answer questions, and provide services such as faxing as well as a myriad of other tasks. Their lot in life is to be perpetually overwhelmed with work yet accomplish minor miracles on a daily basis. Yet despite their hard work I have observed at-

torneys making their life difficult.

The Law Library is another observation point in my travels. Lettice is always ready to render assistance and has worked through terrible budget constraints and now a difficult move. On more than one occasion I have seen attorneys being snide and rude to the Library staff.

Last but not least, I will discuss my observation of the judiciary. We have an awesome group of judges and commissioners here in Snohomish County. I have experienced a Judge stay until 8:00 p.m. during a settlement conference to resolve the final issues. I have had many issues resolved for my clients in a fair and dignified manner at trial. While I did not always get the decision I had hoped for I did feel my client had their day in court and had been given their due process.

Our Snohomish County Court Commissioners have gone above and beyond on many occasions to listen intently despite the parties language barriers, mental health issues, and other intervening problems that make it difficult to understand the legal needs of the parties. On numerous occasions I have witnessed attorneys being sarcastic, rude and even outright tell lies to our Judges and Commissioners. While the judiciary is in a position to sanction an attorney for their courtroom behavior, I question why this behavior happens to begin with?

So now I will discuss the attorneys I observe at the courthouse. Are all the attorneys that commit the above mentioned heinous acts from out of County? I fear not. While many of these attorneys are from a distance there are local attorneys that treat courthouse people poorly as well. I have been fortunate to have a good relationship with most courthouse personnel since I clerked for Judge John Wilson years ago. That job afforded me an inside view on courthouse operations and many co-workers befriended me.

During that time, while I was still in law school my husband went on strike. The courthouse folks provided groceries and anonymous dollars to help me survive so I would not have to leave law school. There is a word I just used in this paragraph that sort of ties it in for me. These courthouse people are my co-workers. The majority of the attorneys that are observed at the Courthouse are courteous, kind and patient. There are not rude, condescending or spiteful. They treat people with the respect that is appropriate among co-workers.

These are my courthouse observations. If the shoe fits, please change your style.

Monthly Report

The general meeting of the SnoCo Young Lawyers Division was held January 13. Meetings will be held on the 2 Tuesday of every month.

Board of Trustee member Karin Young presented a report on developing a membership database and solicited ideas on growing the general membership. She is currently compiling a list of names to create a membership database.

Board of Trustee member Brice Howard presented a report on creating a YLD page on the SnoCo Bar website.

Board of Trustee member Roberta Madow presented a report on creating a budget for the Division and, along with Brice Howard, led a brainstorming session on possible activities for which the Division may need funding. Some of the ideas floated by the group were active participation in Law Day, the SnoCo Bar Association Softball and Golf Tournaments, creating a packet for newly sworn in Snohomish County attorneys, and developing a monthly brown bag lunch speaking series.

Board of Trustee members Amy Allison and Scot Swanson proposed that the Division include a provision in the Bylaws stating that 75% of the members shall be under 35 years old. Such an age limitation will to enable the Division to affiliate with the ABA and possibly receive funding.

Board members Laura Kruse and Christopher Bell presented an overview of the YLD election procedures as outlined in the Bylaws. The Division hopes to hold elections soon after becoming a recognized section of the SnoCo Bar Association.

Young lawyers continued: **Tip of the Month**

If you are working on a dissolution/paternity case in which child support is at issue, always ask your client if one or both parents receives state assistance in the form of medical insurance for the children, food stamps, daycare stipend, or AFDC payments. If a parent is receiving any assistance EXCEPT FOR a daycare stipend alone, then the state must be notified of the pending action.
