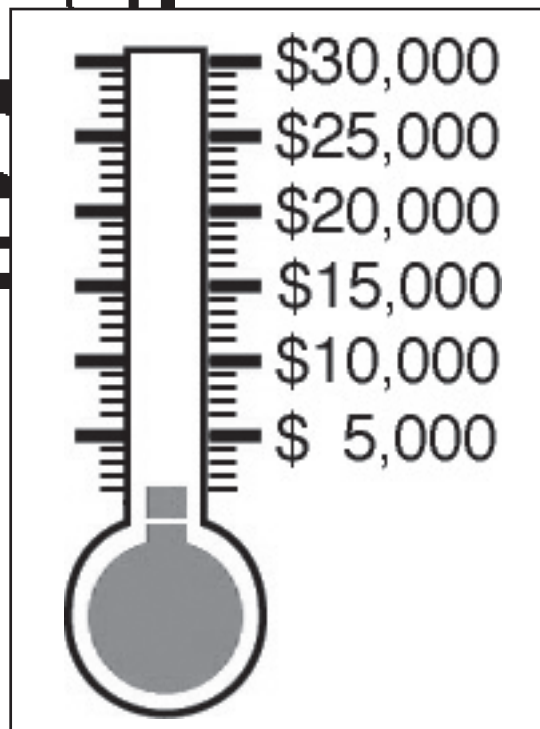

The bow had not been used since I failed to attain the archery merit badge in the boy scouts, and bike was in great shape. I thought I got the better end of the deal, but I understand Larry feels the same way.

If you were a teenager in the 70's, you know this was as essential as the razor scooter is for kids today. My sister Kathy Webber had a yellow one, with the "girl" dip in the middle tube. It was said the Schwinn bike was heavy, but reliable. They still are.

I added fenders to this one, because it rains here, and the derailleur is giving me trouble from time to time, not staying in the lower gears. The seat on this one says "Panasonic" on the back, but there is nothing electronic on the bike. Can't figure that out. I

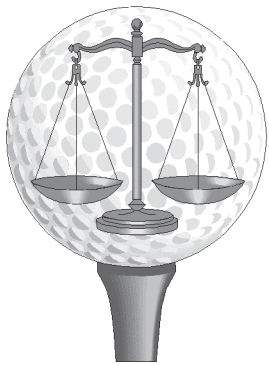

We are extraordinarily grateful for this support, however, we think that an expanded project would be more in line with our efforts and your efforts to promote access to justice.

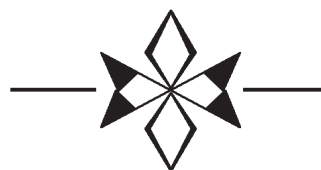
Budget Update

In this climate of decreasing funds and increasing costs we are continually searching for ways to supplement our funding. Unfortunately the legislation we worked on in the 2001 session failed. This bill would have established an additional funding source for county law libraries by allowing the local governing body to attach a surcharge to the filing

fee in Superior Court. While it passed the Senate by a strong majority, it did not get out of the House Judiciary Committee. We are therefore once again requesting supplemental funding from the County, over and above what the statute allows us (RCW 27.24.070). We will not know the results of our request until later this Fall.

We are also preparing the documents necessary to establish the Snohomish County Law Library Foundation as a non-profit corporation. This status would allow us to apply for grant money from foundations offering grants not only for libraries in general, but specific to law, legal education, and justice. The goal is to have this completed by the end of the year thereby allowing us to begin grant writing in 2002.

In the last article I wrote for your newsletter I suggested that using our newer and faster photocopiers on a more regular basis was one very real way for you to contribute to the law library. I am pleased to announce that many of you have done so. Thank you and, as always, we appreciate your continued support.

New Rules Snohomish County District Court Local Rules (Effective September 1, 2001)

Civil Rules - SCLCRLJ

SCLCRLJ 38. Jury Trial

(1)(a)(1) Confirmation Required. On the last court day preceding the jury trial date the party demanding a jury trial shall contact the confirmation clerk at the respective division of the Snohomish County District Court, at the telephone numbers listed below, between 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM, and confirm that the case is going to proceed to jury trial or that some other settlement has been reached.

Confirmation Clerk's telephone numbers for each division are as follows:

Evergreen Division: (360) 805-6787

South Division: (425) 744-6808

Failure of a party to confirm the jury trial or to advise the confirmation clerk that settlement has been reached shall constitute a waiver of the jury trial demand and cause the case to be stricken from the jury trial calendar. Terms may be assessed if the case has to be continued to a different trial date. Stipulated settlements not yet reduced to writing may be put on the record in conformance with CRLJ 2A.

Any case confirmed for jury under this subsection and not proceeding to jury trial shall be subject to such sanctions, including but not limited to jury costs, witness fees and terms, as deemed appropriate by the trial judge.

Criminal Rules - SCLCrRLJ

SCLCrRLJ 6.1.1 Trial By Jury.

(a) Trial by Jury.

(1) Readiness Hearings. All cases set for jury trial shall be assigned both a readiness hearing date and a trial date. The defendant, and the defendant's attorney if the defendant is represented, shall appear at the readiness hearing. The court will inquire as to whether the case is expected to go to trial, the number of witnesses to be

called by each side and the anticipated length of trial; and if all motions, discovery and plea negotiations have been concluded. Any case confirmed for jury trial at the readiness hearing shall remain set on the jury trial date. Failure to appear at the readiness hearing, as required herein, shall constitute a waiver of the defendant's speedy trial rights, and may result in a bench warrant for the defendant's arrest and forfeiture of any bail or bond.

(2) Confirmation Required. On the last court day preceding the jury trial date the defendant, if appearing pro se, or the defendant's attorney if represented by counsel, and the prosecutor shall contact the confirmation clerk at the respective division of the Snohomish County District Court, at the telephone numbers listed below, between 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM, and confirm that the case is going to proceed to jury trial or that some other disposition has been reached.

Confirmation Clerk's telephone numbers for each division are as follows:

South Division: (425) 744-6808

Failure of a party to confirm the jury trial or to advise the confirmation clerk that another disposition has been reached may cause the case to be stricken from the jury trial calendar. Failure of the defendant, if appearing pro se, or the defendant's attorney if represented by counsel, to confirm the jury trial or to advise the confirmation clerk that another disposition has been reached shall constitute a waiver of the defendant's speedy trial rights. Failure of the defendant to appear on the jury trial date may result in a bench warrant for the defendant's arrest and forfeiture of any bail or bond, unless it is confirmed by both parties that a disposition is to be proposed to the court. Dispositions will be heard on the jury trial date or on another date as the court directs.

Any case confirmed for jury under this subsection and not proceeding to jury trial shall be subject to such sanctions, including but not limited to jury costs, witness fees and terms, as deemed appropriate by the trial judge.

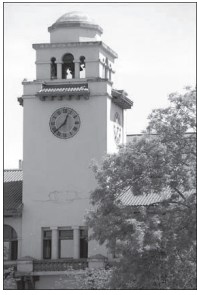
