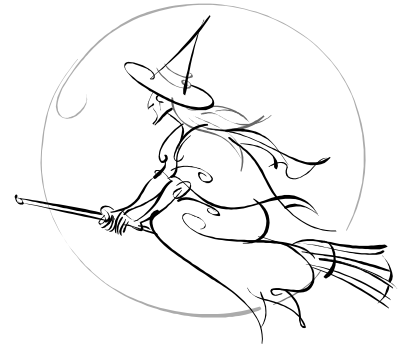

FROM THE DESK OF
THE PRESIDENT,
RUTH WESTBROOK

Summer is over and all of the wonderful vacations and fun summer things we did are sinking into the sunset. September has arrived with a fury. It's now time to reflect on how we are going to proceed with our work-a-day world.

I believe we need to begin to concentrate on how we present ourselves to our peers and to the public at large. Frankly sometimes it seems as if we are always hearing that we have a duty to others, both in our profession and outside our profession. It can on occasion get to be monotonous and sound nagging. But this responsibility comes with choosing our profession. The recent articles in the Herald have brought this to the forefront of my mind.

I come from a family where I was the first person to graduate from college. I still am the only college graduate in my family. As a result of this distinction, when it comes to elections, frequently I receive calls from my family, even as far away as Jefferson County, asking me whom they should vote for. I am sure that we all have had this happen to us at one time or another.

How we present ourselves in the community has a dramatic impact on what the community at large thinks about our profession. How many times have we heard lawyer jokes or heard vile comments concerning attorneys. I know that I have lost count of how often this has happened, even in my own family who are incredibly proud of me.

What does this have to do with elections? Well, let me explain. Things said in articles and letters to the editor have a direct impact on our community. For better or worse, the impression is that everyone in the legal profession shares the view of the writer or speaker.

Don't misunderstand what I am saying. I am an ardent advocate of point-counterpoint debates. I think that is the only way to bring issues to a head.

My concern is not with the format, but with the content. There is never an excuse for being rude and insulting to an opponent or to someone who holds an opposing view.

I would like to share a tale on myself to illustrate this point. I had a trial in Judge French's courtroom several years ago. This was a trial where I had a Perry Mason moment. The opposing attorney was desperately trying to rehabilitate her client, which just was not going to happen. As a result, she began objecting to nearly every question I asked. I became frustrated and after one of her objections, just stood there, not saying anything. Judge French asked if I had another question. I responded that yes I did, but I was waiting for opposing counsel to make another objection.

The moment the words were out of my mouth, I was wishing I could have reached out and retrieved them. Judge French actually raised his voice to me and shouted that in his courtroom, attorneys will ALWAYS behave in a professional manner. I can't remember how long I apologized, but it did take up several minutes.

So while encouraging you to maintain professionalism in both our professional and private lives may sound like I am nagging or may become monotonous, it comes part and parcel with the profession that YOU chose. ☪

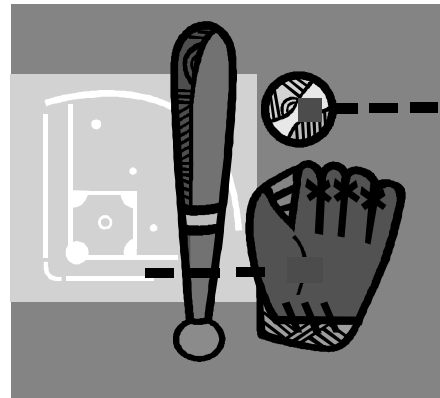

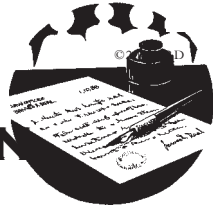
